








#### Organisational Processes & Arrangements



Informal and formal sources of support and care Sustained by the responsive allocation of resources

A fundamental shift in the relationship between person and professional that supports that person to be in the driving seat of their health and social care, with self-management at the heart



- 1. Clear information provided to people
- 2. Mutually agreed upon goals
- 3. An active role for the person
- 4. Positive affect empathy and encouragement from staff

# The Act's Aims - legislation

- Empower community bodies through ownership and/or use of land, buildings, assets and strengthening their voices in the decisions that matter to them.
- Increase the pace and scale of Public Service Reform by a focus on achieving outcomes and improving the process of community planning.





# Opportunities for power, health and social justice

- ...significant opportunities for shifts in the distribution of power: giving communities an active voice e.g. in community planning, transfer of land/assets for community use.
- …addressing inequalities e.g. Part 2 role of CPPs in reducing inequalities of outcome resulting from socio-economic disadvantage
- ...improving health e.g. communities help redesign services or community use of resources





# But....

- Some communities may be more able to take advantage of the opportunities the Act offers
- Both the processes and the changes these processes may bring about have the potential for increasing inequalities within and across different communities (of place, interest and identity)





# So...

- It is important to evaluate, to identify what, if any change (and in what direction) implementation brings about, particularly from a community and inequalities perspective
- To map out the important areas for evaluation, identify what 'success' would look like and how this could be measured GCPH, NHS Health Scotland and University of Glasgow have been working together to contribute to the discussion.
- This will be informed by, and complement, other work going on elsewhere to evaluate aspects of the Act.
