Co-production refers to the reciprocal relationship between service providers and users that draws on the knowledge, ability and resources of both to develop solutions that are successful, sustainable and cost-effective.







It stems from the recognition that

if organisations are to deliver successful services, they must understand the needs of their users and engage them closely in the design and delivery of those services.







This means people 03 and communities truly playing a part in how decisions are made, at every stage of the decision-making process having a say in what's needed, how it's developed and how it can be delivered - where things happen 'with' people, instead of 'to' them.





Co-production goes beyond participation

and partnership working because it requires people to work together on an equal basis. It means breaking down traditional professional boundaries, sharing power and contributing lived experience, skills and ideas about what works, to make our communities better and to reshape the relationships that communities have with services.
